## **REFLECTING ON THE GOSPEL**

The readings this Sunday remind us that God is gracious, sharing divine life with us: “God so loved” us that God “gave his only Son” so that “the world might be saved”. Yes, God sent the Son so that we might have life. Divine life and love extend beyond the inner intimacy of the three Persons of the Holy Trinity to us. Much more than a theological concept, the Trinity is the mystery of a lived Presence within and among us, made visible as mercy and graciousness and as joy, encouragement, and peace. In the second reading St. Paul admonishes the community to behave with concrete manifestations of Trinitarian living: rejoice, mend our ways, “encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace.” All of us know how difficult it can be to live with others. What makes community possible is that divine life is already within us. We can be a community of persons because the Holy Trinity shares their divine life with us. So when we perform gracious acts, it is really God working in and through us. In this way our lives, then, can become manifestations of the Holy Trinity itself. While the Trinity remains a great mystery, it is nonetheless manifested in the way we live with each other. The model for our community living is God’s very own saving acts on our behalf from the very beginning of time. God “pardons our wickedness” because God is “merciful and gracious”. The challenge here runs in two directions. First, we must move beyond ourselves in self-giving in order to act with the graciousness and mercy of God. Second, we must cultivate an inner life centered on God. The mystery of the Trinity calls us to go both beyond ourselves and deeper into ourselves-to an intimacy with God that turns us outward in mercy and graciousness to others. This is
